Inquiry on Left Side Mirror Size

Information compiled on May 18, 2010

The Question: What size exterior left side mirrors do your buses have?

Ben Franklin Transit says... We have Hadley brand mirrors, they measure 14 inches tall, 9 1/2 inches wide and are electric remote control adjustment with turn signal indicators in the lower mirror. They are a split mirror with the bottom mirror being convex.

C-Tran says...The sizes vary somewhat but they range 10" high by 8" wide flat with a 5" convex below that.

Clallam Transit says... 18" x 9"

Community Transit says.... On our fleet, the majority of exterior mirrors are set up as follows: The street side (LS) mirrors are 7x10 flat upper glass with an adjustable convex below the flat glass. The convex measures approximately 3.5x7. The curbside mirrors (RS) are 7x14 convex glass with a rectangular stick-on convex mounted on the lower part of the glass.

CUBS says... We have 3 different vintage buses all with different size mirrors.

8x8 non power with a 4" round convex mirror attached to arm.

12X9 power, split mirror convex on bottom.

10x11 power, split mirror convex on bottom.

We mount the street side mirror about level with the bottom window frame. The complaint with the 12x9 is a blind spot it creates, people in sidewalks, pulling out into traffic etc.

Grays Harbor says... The driver's side mirrors we use are as follows:

On the newer Gilligs the housing is 10" x 11" with the mirror being 8 1/2" x 9 1/2"

The older Gilligs have rubber framed mirrors measuring 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" (mirror 7 x 7)

On the New Flyers and the Phantoms the mirror housing is 9" x 13" with the dual mirrors surface measuring 8" x 11".

Island Transit says...10 X 8 ½ on our Gilligs.

Jefferson Transit says.... We have 8 ½ X 8 ½ AND 10 X 7 inch mirrors.

Kitsap Transit says... The Gillig routed buses are 7 inches wide and 9 and one half tall with a spot mirror of 7 inches wide and 4 inches tall.

The Orions in routed service are 8 by 8 inches with a spot mirror of 8 inches wide and 4 inches tall.

The Eldorados are seven and a half wide and 10 inches tall with a spot mirror of 6 by 6 inches.

The International is routed service are the same as the Gilligs.

Link Transit says....Left side mirror is 13 X 9 inch split mirror.

Mason Transit says... We have several different sizes. Each group of vehicles changes with upgraded options, etc. As long as the minimum square inch requirement designated by Safety Standards mandated by the state is met, you should be fine.

Pacific Transit says.... We have a split mirror, approximately 15" x 8" .

Pierce Transit says... The overall body size is 8"w x 15"H with mirror glass dimensions of 7"w x 9 ½" H and 4 ½ - 7" w- tapered and 4"H (this dimension is for the small convex mirror glass. Skagit Transit says.... Our fixed route coaches are:
Gillig 8x8 with a 5 in round attached. NABI are 15x 7 split.

DAR is: ABBOC 13x9 split, Ford 10.5 x7.5 with 6in attached squared and Chevy 15x8.

Spokane Transit says... Here is the measurement of the roadside/Left side mirror. 10"W X 16"L.

Valley Transit says... We use B & R mirrors. Both left and right side. 13" tall by 10" wide, split glazing - flat and convex.

We mount them high, the top of the left mirror is roughly even with the top of the windshield and mounted even with the A pillar. The Right hand mirror is slightly lower, mounted forward of the windshield.

Yakima Transit says...8 inch by 15 inch, 2 piece, flat and convex
