

Policies regarding Bus Shelter Contracts

The Question: A member is installing new bus shelters, information kiosks, etc. in their downtown area. Due to tight deadlines the member would like to know if you have a bus shelter contract? A kiosk contract? Or an installation contract, or all of the above they could piggyback on. If you do please send a name and phone number.

CUBS says... We do not.

Everett Transit says... We do not.

Grant Transit says... We do not.

Grays Harbor Transit says... Sorry we do not.

Kitsap Transit says... We do not have on-going contracts for shelters/kiosk. We purchase the shelters as we need them (usually 5 at a time). Our purchase schedule runs 1 to 2 years depending on the demand. When we have a location for a shelter identified we find a concrete contractor to pour the pad. Our maintenance crew places the shelter after the concrete has set for 2 weeks.

Mason Transit says... We do not.

Pacific Transit says... We do not have a contract.

Pullman Transit says... Since Pullman Transit is a City of Pullman entity all of these kinds of operations are handled within the city system and not contracted out.

Skagit Transit says... We do not.

Twin Transit says... Sorry, but we do not have a shelter contract.

Valley Transit says... We do not have any shelter contracts that would help in this situation.
