

Policies regarding Hazardous Materials Containment

Information compiled May 21, 2007

The Question: A member is trying to update their procedures for containing spills from hazardous materials such as fuel, and oil. If you have emergency procedures for hazardous material containment, please attach a copy and return.

Everett Transit says... We do not.

Grant Transit says... We don't keep Oil in great volumes or fuel on site. We had oil spill out of a vehicle when it bottomed out on a curb but the county haz mat team responds to those. Other than keeping the phone number to the haz mat team handy, we don't have additional procedures to address that.

Island Transit says... The only thing we do if it is a small spill, we sprinkle absorbent granules over it then sweep it up and discard it. If it is a big spill we call ICOM (911) and report it for the Fire Department or a hazmat team to come clean it up.

Jefferson Transit says... We are working on ours and haven't made much progress. I would also love to have a copy of anything you receive from the larger transit agencies.

Kitsap Transit says... We have specifically trained employees who are certificated and refreshed annually for hazardous spill response. There is no specific policy, just that in the event of the spill, the trained employees are the only ones who can respond.

Pacific Transit says... We really don't have much to speak of.

Pullman Transit says... That I know of Transit doesn't have an individual plan just for us. If we have a spill the dispatchers are directed to contain the spill if possible and notify the Fire department so they can respond. After they have responded, contained the spill and left we have

either the city Maintenance department or our bus washers go out and do a clean up of the area. I'm sure the city would have a comprehensive plan but I don't have a copy of it.
