

## Policies regarding Interlocal Agreements for Sharing Operators

Information compiled April 20, 2007

**The Question:** The agency would like to know if any you have Interlocal Agreements for the sharing of operators and equipment for special events you serve.

**Columbia County Transit** says... We do not have agreements with anyone else in providing service during local events, as there are no other agencies to draw from in our area that have extra manpower or vehicles at that. Generally our regular service only operates Mon-Fri so when there are special events on the weekends, we have vehicles and operators available to provide this added service.

**CUBS** says... CUBS' does not have an Interlocal Agreement for the sharing of operators and equipment for special events

**Grays Harbor Transit** says... We do not have any interlocal agreements with anyone for sharing of operators or equipment.

**Island Transit** says... We do very little extra service. We always ask the person who requests such service to contact the others on the Island to make sure that they are getting the service before we do. If we do such service, like last weeks marathon, we check on our available Operators and buses before we agree. We do not assign these trips to the Operator but this is done on a volunteer basis only. We do not have a union so this is not an issue.

**Kitsap Transit** says... We do not share operators and equipment

**Link Transit** says... As there are no other transit agencies close to Link's service area we have no viable option to share equipment or drivers.....sorry we can't offer assistance on this matter.

**Mason Transit** says... Mason Transit has no interlocal agreement. We have been in discussion with the school district because we already have an operating contract with them to provide supplemental service as a PM tripper. So far we haven't needed to call on them.

**Pacific Transit** says.... We don't have any interlocal agreements.

**Skagit Transit** says... Currently Skagit Transit does not participate in these types of events with additional service. If an event occurs and our system route services the area of the event we will advertise with the event that transit is available to that location via that specific route

**Valley Transit** says.... Valley Transit does not have any interlocal agreements for sharing operators and equipment.

**Yakima Transit** says... No.
