**Call to Order**

President Macdonald called the meeting to order at 9:00 am welcoming everyone to the hybrid meeting. A sign in sheet was passed around the room, virtual attendees were captured by staff. Macdonald asked if there were any changes to the agenda, hearing no changes, he asked for a motion to accept the agenda. **Huxtable moved to approve the agenda. Shinnars seconded the motion, and the motion passed.** New Board members and guests were introduced.

**Public Comment on Consent Agenda, Discussion, Potential Action Items**

Macdonald asked for public comment. No public comments were received.

Macdonald asked if there were any items to remove from the consent agenda. There were no items removed from the consent agenda. **Pesta moved to approve the consent agenda. Nash seconded the motion, and the motion passed.**

Discussion / Potential Action Items

2025 Executive Committee Work Plan

Christianson said the 2025 work plan had been updated and noted information about captives will be presented at the July meeting as the guest speaker was not available to attend this meeting. The Board will see the separated deductibles topic which was part of the retreat. There were no questions regarding the Work Plan.

New Best Practice: Compensation Analysis Guide

Kerrigan shared the new Compensation Analysis Best Practices Guide. She explained how the Best Practice was developed, thanked the Human Resources (HR) Managers; Jennifer Davidson, Skagit Transit; Mary Pauly, Kitsap Transit and Julie Shipman, Link Transit who helped develop the guide, and the Risk and Opportunities Committee (ROC) for their review and input. This Best Practice will be placed on the website, distributed to HR departments, and be part of the Best Practice compliance visits with Iddings.

Technology Grant – Ben Franklin Transit

Kerrigan shared the Technology Grant application from Ben Franklin Transit for telematics on their large rideshare fleet. Ben Franklin is requesting \$48,802. The ROC has reviewed and recommends approving the request. **Shipman moved to approve the Ben Franklin Transit Technology Grant in the amount of \$48,802. Larson seconded the motion, and the motion passed.**

Technology Grant Proposal or Sunset

Kerrigan explained the Technology Grant program is on a five-year cycle, and the Pool is nearing the end of the cycle. A decision needs to be made to continue status quo, revamp, or end the Technology Grant program as we head into the 2026 budget cycle. The ROC would like to see the technology catalog updated and recommends the Technology Grant program continue. Macdonald asked what would happen to the funds that are already budgeted if the program were to end. Branson said anything in the reserve would be eligible to be awarded. Each of the EC members indicated the program was worthy of continuing, there were ideas of a tiered approach where the first half of the year it was open only to new technologies, and the second half for proven technologies. Other ideas included potentially having proven technologies awarded at a reduced percentage and awarding a contribution less than the 50% that help reduce risk or improve safety. Another idea was to fund only certain types of projects for a couple of years for example, telematics. Member Representatives were asked to discuss during the Member Representative meetings and perhaps the ROC can bring proposed language back at the September meeting. Branson said the 2026 budget proposal will include funding to have \$500,000 available for Technology Grant awards in 2026.

### Nominations for Vice President

Macdonald said there are four candidates for Vice President, Deutsch, Hilby, Jordan, and Larson reminding everyone nominations will be accepted from the floor as well as withdrawals.

### Executive Director Search Advisory Committee (EDSAC) Report

Larson said the EDSAC met on June 2, the committee agreed to a five-week advertisement and is asking the EC to approve the Executive Director salary range and job description. Stakeholder interviews have been completed. The recruitment was posted June 24 at on the Prothman website ([www.prothman.com](http://www.prothman.com)) and on WSTIP's website. Prothman will interview and rank candidates and present candidates to the EDSAC at its August 11 meeting. The EDSAC will review candidates on August 11 and provide feedback to identify four finalists to present to the EC at its meeting August 28. In September, the Pool would hold an in-person candidate "meet and greet" and the EC would conduct candidate interviews in executive session. Macdonald thanked Larson for the report and for serving as interim chair until a Vice President is elected.

### EDSAC – Approve Salary Range

Macdonald asked for a motion to approve the salary range for the Executive Director. ***Pesta moved to approve the salary range for the Executive Director as presented. Shipman seconded the motion, and the motion passed.***

### EDSAC – Approve Job Description

Macdonald asked for a motion to approve the Executive Director job description. ***Larson moved to approve the Executive Director job description. Huxtable seconded the motion, and the motion passed.***

### Executive Session

There was no Executive Session.

### Sub-Committee Reports

#### Executive Director Search Advisory Committee (EDSAC)

Larson reported committee members are: Brandy Pesta, Jenny George, Crystle Stidham, Amy Cleveland, and Nancy Williams. Staff support is Tracey Christianson and Rick Hughes, in addition to Steve Worthington from Prothman. The recruitment for Executive Director is on the Prothman website. Macdonald thanked Larson for his report.

#### Governance Policy Committee (GPC)

Macdonald said there are three policies on the Board agenda for approval and once approved, the work for the GPC will be complete for the year.

#### Board Development Committee (BDC)

Larson stated the BDC met May 30 reviewed and discussed the March meeting feedback and set the Member Rep Meeting agenda. There was mixed feedback regarding Pooling Basics but we are going to continue to finish the three modules. Staff are working to fix issues with microphones, they thanked Iddings for his assistance. Macdonald thanked Larson for his report.

#### Risk and Opportunities Committee (ROC)

Deutsch said the ROC met on June 11, reviewed several Best Practices, discussed the Technology Grant program (he will spare everyone details since it was already a topic today), the safety sub-group and the Safety Summit, near miss reporting and the data that is being collected. Please reach out to Deutsch or Kerrigan if you are interested in serving on the ROC. Macdonald thanked Deutsch for his report.
